

This view of ECHA's tasks fits into the construct of the three legislative institutions: the Commission, as the guardian of the EU Treaties and proposer of legislation, the European Council and the European Parliament deciding and Member States enforcing. The agencies' role is in-between the Member States and the three institutions, serving the EU based on the input from Member States.

Integrated Regulatory Strategy (IRS) 2020 towards 2027 goals

Since 2013, the SVHC Roadmap followed by ECHA's Integrated Regulatory Strategy have provided a coherent basis for a close collaboration among ECHA, Member States and the European Commission to achieve the aims of REACH and CLP. The implementation of these strategies also contributes to reaching the United Nation's 2030 Sustainable Development Goals concerning chemicals.

Integrated Regulatory Strategy (IRS) 2020 towards 2027 goals

The Integrated Regulatory Strategy provides an effective means of identifying substances which either need additional EU risk management or are sufficiently risk managed. This contribution to the three institutions' implementation of the legislation helps ensure a high level of protection and the smooth functioning of the EU internal market.

Integrated Regulatory Strategy (IRS) 2020 towards 2027 goals

- Accelerate data generation
- Intensify indentification (groupped of substances of concerns – e.g. Petroleum and Coal; Phtalates and Bisphenol; MISA - metal and inorganics sectoral approaches)
- Accelerate regulatory actions
- Ensure appropriate intervention by authorities and industry,
- Meet information requirements among stakeholders an registrants
- Improve comunication on safe use in the supply chain
